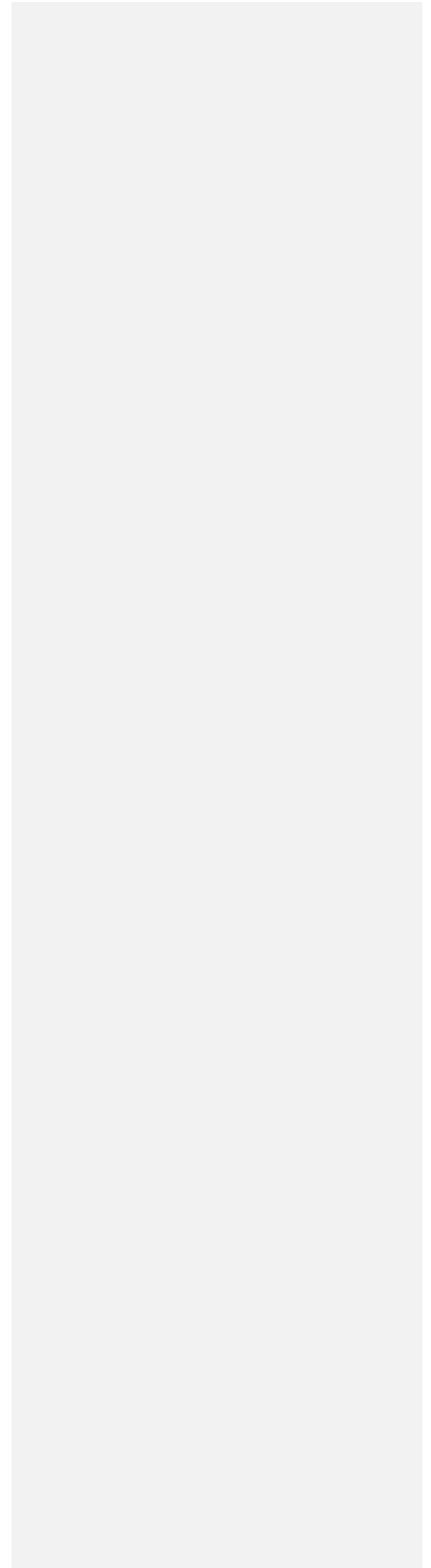


Pima County Mandatory Spay Neuter Ordinance
Proposed Change Summaries

- Add mandatory spay neuter requirement for dogs and cats redeemed by their owners from any shelter in Pima County.
- Exceptions to requirement include:
 - One time exemption for current license or first impound for cat
 - Altered
 - Veterinary Waiver for health reasons
 - Pay \$250

ORDINANCE 2010-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PIMA COUNTY, ARIZONA, RELATING TO ANIMALS; AMENDING THE PIMA COUNTY CODE BY AMENDING CHAPTER 6.04 AMENDING SECTION 6.04.090 AUTHORITY TO ALTER DOGS AND CATS RELEASED FROM A SHELTER

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PIMA COUNTY, ARIZONA:

SECTION 1: Chapter 6.04, Section 6.04.090 is amended to require alteration of all dogs and cats released from a shelter unless exempted as specified:

CHAPTER 6.04

ANIMAL CONTROL REGULATIONS

6.04.090 Mandatory spay/neuter program for dogs and cats.

The following standards are ~~approved-established~~ for the adoption ~~or redemption by the owner~~ of any ~~unclaimed~~ dog or cat ~~from Pima Animal Care Center or another shelter, as defined by Arizona Revised Statute 11-1022.H, in Pima County:~~

A. ~~Subject to the following conditions, Any dog or cat may be redeemed by its owner from Pima Animal Care Center or another shelter in Pima County and any dog or cat held for the period required by law and not reclaimed by its owner from by the Pima Animal Care Center or another shelter in Pima County for the period required by law and not reclaimed by its owner~~ may be released for adoption; ~~subject to the following conditions:~~

1. The ~~adoptingadopter or redeeming~~ owner must pay ~~a fee~~ applicable fees pursuant to ~~the Center's or shelter's pricing policies and fee tables, Section 6.04.060 (D), (E). A transportation fee of no more than six dollars per dog or cat may also be charged to adoption owners.~~

2. Pima Animal Care Center ~~or the shelter~~ will insure that all such animals are spayed or neutered and ~~microchipped~~ micro chipped prior to release to the ~~adoptingadopter or redeeming~~ owner unless ~~the a~~ veterinarian determines that the animal has medical contraindications that would prevent or require postponement of surgery. ~~For animals redeemed from Pima Animal Care Center, the redeeming owner may request to have the animal altered at a veterinarian of their choice and at the owner's expense. Should the owner request to have the animal transported to a veterinarian of the owner's choice, the owner will schedule the surgery, make surgery payment arrangements with the veterinarian and have the veterinarian advise the Pima Animal Care Center of when to transport the animal to the veterinarian's clinic. After consult with the veterinarian and if the request is approved by Pima Animal Care Center, the Pima Animal Care Center will transport the animal to the veterinarian and the Pima Animal Care Center may charge the owner a transportation fee of seventy dollars per dog or cat transported.~~

3. Owned animals may be redeemed unaltered from any shelter in Pima County;
a. after a first impoundment for each dog in any twelve month period if the dog is currently licensed at the time of impoundment, or
b. after a first impoundment for each cat in any twelve month period, or

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c. if the owner pays a \$250 recovery fee or

d. If ~~the a~~ veterinarian determines that medical contraindications for surgery exist that would require postponement of surgery, a spay/neuter certificate will authorize postponement of the surgery until such time that ~~the a~~ veterinarian determines that surgery can be performed in a safe, humane manner.

4. If a veterinarian determines that medical contraindications for surgery exist in an adopted animal that would require postponement of surgery, a spay/neuter certificate will authorize postponement of the surgery until such time that a veterinarian determines that surgery can be performed in a safe, humane manner. If ~~the a~~ veterinarian determines ~~the an adopted~~ animal is permanently disqualified for surgery and would be capable of reproduction the adopted animal ~~will may be required to~~ be returned to Pima Animal Care Center or the shelter from which the animal was adopted, the adoption will may be cancelled, and the ~~adopting owner~~adopter will be refunded all applicable fees.

5. The adopting or redeeming party shall reclaim the animal following surgery as directed by the veterinarian. Failure to comply will result in a charge for extra board. Animals Unclaimed animals from Pima Animal Care Center or a shelter after seven (7) days following the animal's scheduled surgery date may be declared abandoned.

B. The agreement to adopt an animal from Pima Animal Care Center shall require the adopting party to agree to hold harmless and defend the county, its officers and employees for loss, injury or damages arising out of or in connection with services of this program.
